Robert E. Lee High School is part of the Tyler Independent School District, located in Tyler, TX, in the heart of Smith County. Our city, known for civic pride and business opportunities, is a thriving community of steady corporate and residential growth. Roses and oil are two industries which support the area. Tyler ISD encompasses 193 square miles with a population of over 100,000. The school district instructs over 18,000 students in seventeen elementary schools, six middle schools, two alternative high schools, a special education campus, and two high schools. Within the local commuting area, three institutions of higher learning offer post-secondary education: Tyler Junior College, Texas College and the University of Texas at Tyler. The City of Tyler maintains a small town atmosphere while offering its residents many cultural, recreational and entertainment advantages of a large city.

**THE CURRICULUM**

Robert E. Lee course offerings include college preparatory, on level, and career and technology courses in all accepted disciplines. Courses are taught in PIB, Pre-AP, AP, IB, On Level, Special Education, and Dual Credit. AP courses are taught in English, Calculus, Statistics, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, American History, World Geography, World History, Government, Economics, Computer Science, Art, Psychology, Foreign Language and Environmental Science.

**THE SCHEDULE**

The schedule at Robert E. Lee is offered on a hybrid schedule consisting of six 90 minute classes and two 60 minute classes on A/B days. Students may earn up to eight credits per year.

**RANK IN CLASS AND GPA**

Rank in class is determined by a cumulative numerical average of semester grades for all courses in grades 9-12. This numerical average is weighted as follows: numerical grade plus 10 points per semester for AP/IB courses and numerical grade plus 5 points per semester for Pre AP/Pre-IB courses. Student GPA includes all courses and is reported on an un-weighted 4 point scale.

## DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT PLAN

The Distinguished Achievement Plan is the most rigorous Graduation Plan in the State of Texas. The DAP focuses on demonstrated student performance at the college or professional level.

In addition to course requirements students must complete four advanced measures using any combination of the following:

- AP Exams with a score of 3 or higher
- An approved research project
- College courses (scoring B or better)
- National Merit Commended, Semifinalist or Finalist
