Student Identification Badges

First implemented as an additional means of supporting campus safety at Moore, the Student Identification (ID) Badge has proven to be beneficial in many areas. Obviously, a badge identifies a student as belonging at this school and gives other school personnel and substitute teachers an invaluable tool for correctly identifying the students in their class. As students at Moore receive academic and athletic honors, and participate in various school clubs and organizations, they are encouraged to decorate their badges with the stickers earned through these activities. This is just one more way they can show that they are “living the brand” at Moore. The full policy can be found in your child’s student agenda, and has been included below for your review.

Student ID Badge Policy

Students are required to wear school identified ID’s and lanyards. These ID’s have been issued, and the following guidelines apply to their use.

- Students must wear an ID on their person at all times while on school grounds during the school day. Students who do not have a permanent ID may be denied admission to any non-instructional school events such as athletic events, school dances, pep rallies, school wide dress up days, etc.
- Students must present their ID to any school official upon request.
- Students who display their ID during school hours may be eligible for random incentives at school discretion.
- Students who repeatedly fail to wear their ID will be subject to more severe school disciplinary sanctions/consequences.
- The Moore office staff will dis-able the bar code when students withdraw from the Moore campus, thus allowing students to keep their ID.

Students who refuse to wear their ID will be given an immediate consequence.

- ID’s are not hall passes. However, students may be required to show their ID in addition to carrying their grade level hall pass.
- Schools are requiring ID’s to improve School Safety and to access school programs such as library, food service, textbooks, buses and other functions as technology-based applications increase.
- Moore will charge a \$1.00 fee for temporary replacement (good for only one day) and a \$5.00 fee for the replacement of a lost ID and lanyard.

Parents are asked to support this initiative by helping to ensure that their child wears their ID every day.
