The children of Texas come in all sizes, shapes, colors and abilities. They do not all learn the same way, but they do ALL learn. Do you know of an infant, child or teenager who has trouble hearing, seeing, talking, walking, using their hands, or relating to adults or other children? Public school programs can serve these children from ages 3 to 22. Children with severe hearing or vision impairment may be eligible to receive services from birth. Free disability screenings are available.
