

Food Service Charge Policy

Charge Policy, Elementary Schools (Including Early Childhood Center and Boshears)

For all Elementary Schools there will be a charge limit of (five days). Once the maximum amount has been met, the student will be offered a reimbursable meal consisting of a meat/meat alternate, whole grain, a choice of vegetable, a choice of fruit, and a choice of milk. Charge slips will be sent home and if the family chooses, an automated phone system will be utilized to notify parents of overdrawn accounts. Charges can be paid several ways; at the school cafeteria during business hours, online (a small convenience fee applies), or by coming to the food service central office. If you feel you qualify for the Free/Reduced meal program, please contact our office for information.

Charge Policy, Middle Schools

For all Middle Schools there will be a charge limit of (three days). Students are not allowed to charge snack items or a-la-carte items, only reimbursable meals. Once the maximum amount has been met, the student will be offered a turkey and cheese sandwich, a choice of vegetable, a choice of fruit, and a choice of milk. Students will be notified each time they charge and the amount of charges allowed in an attempt to avoid overdrawn accounts. If the family chooses, an automated phone system will be utilized to notify parents of overdrawn accounts. Charges can be paid several ways; at the school cafeteria during business hours, online (a small convenience fee applies), or by coming to the food service central office.
